

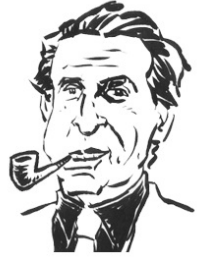

FOCUS QUESTIONS

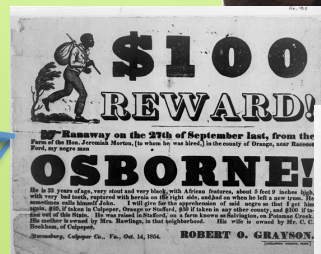
How did runaway slaves intensify the conflict over slavery in the 1850s?

There are SIX people mentioned in this ad besides Osborne. Create a chart that shows the relationship between them.



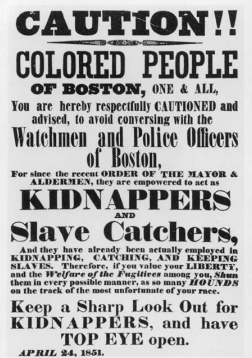
Runaway Slave Advertisement from Antebellum Virginia, 1854
